Out of area registration: In hours urgent primary medical care (including home visits) Enhanced Service

Background

At the January 2018 meeting of the North East Lincolnshire CCG Joint Co-Commissioning Meeting, a query was raised regarding the Out of Area Registration scheme. This paper has been prepared to provide further detail regarding the local arrangements for this scheme.

Current local arrangements

In 2014 NHS England offered an enhanced service to GP Practices for Out of Area Registration. This service is in place due to the fact that all GP practices are able to register patients from outside their traditional practice boundary areas without any obligation to provide home visits for such patients. NHS England are responsible for commissioning in-hours urgent medical care (Monday – Friday 8:00 – 18:30) and home visit arrangements when needed at or near the home of such patients who register with a practice away from their home (such as patients who may find it preferable to register with a practice near their work place etc.). From 1st April 2018, the responsibility for commissioning this service will lie with the CCG, as part of the delegated commissioning arrangements.

A copy of the enhanced service and NHS England Guidance document is attached. We understand that patients (at home) requiring access to such care would contact NHS 111 and be guided to the relevant service(s) that have been commissioned from local practices. The NEL practices that are currently signed up to the scheme are shown below.
